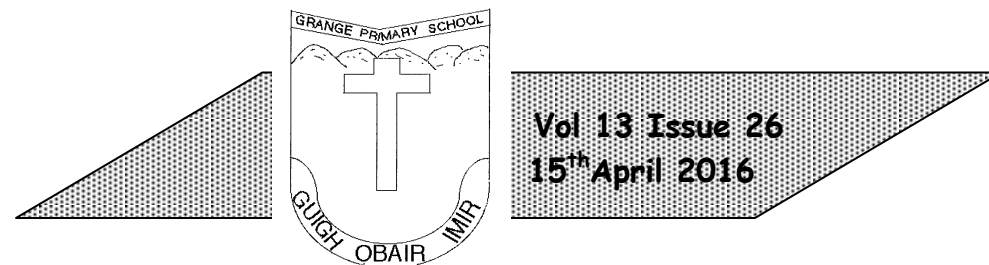

<p>Primary 7 Called By Name Ceremony: On 5th May, during Thursday morning mass, the Primary 7 children preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation will participate in the mass, with the theme being ‘Called by Name.’ Any parents or family members, who are available, are warmly invited to attend.</p>
<p>Trocaire Bun Sales: Well done and thank you to the children (and parents/family members) in Primary one who held their bun sale last week and raised the wonderful sum of £41. Today it is the turn of the pupils from P2/3 class. Buns will cost 10p/20p each</p>
<p>Feis an Duin: Well done to the children who went along to represent our school at Feis an Duin last Saturday. Hopefully they enjoyed their day out.</p>
<p>Mass attendance: We thank the Primary 5/6 children who attended mass yesterday and took part in the liturgy.</p>
<p>Our School in the Parish: The family of P4 pupil Matthew Speers will participate during the Offertory at this Sunday’s mass in Our Lady of Lourdes, Grange. We ask that each family attending mass make their presence known to Kathleen Doran before mass commences on the day. If any families swap their dates, please notify Mrs Sloan, so she can update Fr. Dillon and Fr. Cahill prior to the date of the mass. Many thanks.</p>
<p>Sacramental Services: We look forward to celebrating, Holy Communion at 10.00am on Saturday 7th and Confirmation at 4.00pm on Monday 9th May. Our school will close at 12.30 pm on the day of Confirmation.</p>
<p>Holy Communion: Last week, all parents of children in P4 received a letter requesting information in relation to the Holy Communion ceremony and the celebration afterwards in school. We ask that any remaining responses are returned to school on Monday coming. Similarly, we kindly ask that parents of pupils in Primary 3 also return their reply in response to a request for their assistance on the day.</p>
<p>Cycling Proficiency: A decision on the details of provision of this programme for Primary 7 pupils will be communicated to parents following the return of Pupil responses.</p>
<p>Inside Out Primary 7 Workshop: The P7 pupils joined around a further 100 pupils surrounding primary schools in attending this Social & Personal Development & Programme on Tuesday. Parents are requested to ask their child about the details of the programme and to use the opportunity as a catalyst for discussion in relation to the information covered through the workshop.</p>
<p>Transport Assistance: Any parent who believes they might be eligible for transport assistance (Rooney bus) either currently or next September is asked to contact school for the appropriate application form and details.</p>

<p>Pupil Health & Welfare: There has been an outbreak in local schools of a virulent strain of chicken pox. Advice has also been issued that parents should NOT administer Nurofen / Ibrufen to control a child’s temperature when they have contracted chicken pox. The active ingredients in this medication can worsen the infection of the disease. Treatment with Calpol is recommended. Public Health information advises that a child is kept off school for 5 days following the appearance of spots.</p>
<p>ACTIV SPORT: We have great numbers attending our afterschool activities on Thursday. The sessions will continue for the initial 5 week period and we will then see how many children are interested in continuing on into June. <i>We would ask that children ensure they bring a fleece top / light coat to school on the days of the Activsport as they will invariably be outside for activities.</i></p>
<p>P1-3 Gaelic Coaching: Our Gaelic coaching for children in P1-3 began on Wednesday with thanks to the members of An Ríocht’s coaching team.</p>
<p>Future Events: We are scheduled to have our Sports Day on Friday 3rd June. As in recent years, we will be looking for parents and family members to act as Team Leaders for our ‘Alternative Sports’ activities in the morning. Keep a look out for the request note. We are also planning to hold our Environmental Beach Clean on Monday 13th June down at Greencastle.</p>
