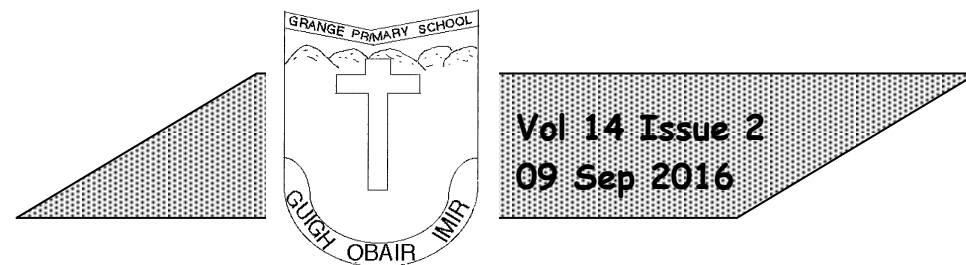

School closes for the Summer Break on Friday 30 June 2017 @ 12noon.

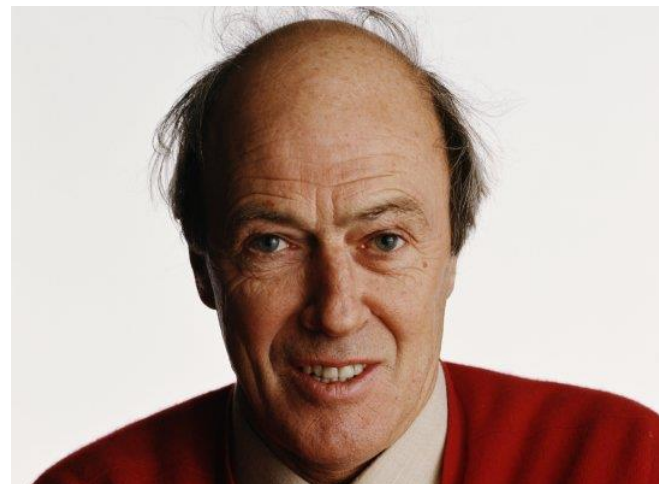

<p>Primary One: A ‘First Days at School’ photo of our Primary One class was in this week’s edition of ‘The Mourne Observer’. We hope you all got a copy.</p>
<p>Head Boy/Girl: Next week, we will be seeking nominations and letters of application from our P7 pupils for the positions of Head Boy and Head Girl for this academic year.</p>
<p>Back to School: We emphasise to parents the importance of completing and returning ALL consent forms as soon as possible providing school with up to date mobile contact numbers so as to enable us to make contact in case of an emergency.</p>
<p>Safeguarding & Child Protection: <i>Our school Safeguarding team consists of Mr.S. Rogers & Mrs. C. Stack (Governors); Mrs R. Mc Ateer (Designated Teacher); Ms. D. Hughes (Deputy Designated Teacher); and Mr. S. Mc Kinley (Principal).</i></p>
<p>Child Safeguarding: In our last whole school review of issues relating to Child Protection and school procedures, we draw parents’ attention to the procedure for removing a child during the course of a normal school day. If a parent knows in advance of an occasion when a child will be collected early from school, they should inform school in advance either in writing or through the secretary. When the child is to be collected, parents should report to the office (9.30am – 1.00pm) where Mrs Murnion will make arrangements. Thereafter, (1.00 – 2.45pm) parents should gain entrance through the front door and make contact with either the Principal / Vice-Principal. On the occasion of a child being removed early from school, parents must sign a Register in the office. Parents are advised that under no circumstances should they proceed directly to a child’s classroom without first making contact through the office.</p>
<p>Pupil Collection: The parking bay area at the front of the school is now clearly marked as a BUS ONLY area. Parents are asked NOT to park in this area when dropping off or collecting children, but to use the CARPARK and to walk their children into the school yard. This is for everybody’s safety. Last year, one or both buses were unable to pull in to allow children to get on the bus safely.</p>
<p>Money Matters: The cost of school dinners remains £2.50 per day/ £12.50 per week. We ask that, as far as possible, money for dinners each week is brought in to school on Monday or Tuesday to assist with banking arrangements.</p>
<p>Milk: All pupils can avail of 1/3 pint of milk each day at a subsidised cost of £0.21/day. Any children wishing to take milk in Term 1 should return the Reply Slip sent home.</p>
<p>Altar Servers: A new rota for altar servers will commence shortly. We ask again that any child who believes they could help out serving at masses in Grange, to please let us know.</p>
<p>Beginning Year Mass: Our first whole school mass will be in Grange Chapel on Thursday 29th September at 9.30am, where P7 pupils will participate in the Liturgy.</p>
<p>African Drumming Lessons: Children from P5 & 6 will shortly receive details of an exciting Music Project taking place in November. It’s sure to be a BIG HIT.</p>

<p>Tin Whistle Lessons: All pupils in P4-7 received a letter outlining the opportunity to avail of tin whistle lessons again this year with Mr. Danny Mc Greevy. We encourage pupils to have a go and ask that all outstanding permission forms be returned .</p>
<p>Class Library Visits: Thursday 15th September sees the first visit of the P5/6 class to Kilkeel Library as part of our continuing partnership with them in the promotion of reading.</p>
<p>Pupil Health and Safety: We remind all parents that we have a child in school with a diagnosed NUT ALLERGY. Please ensure no nuts or products containing nuts are sent to school as part of lunch items.</p>
<p>Flu Vaccination Programme: We have been notified that all primary school pupils will be offered the ‘flu vaccine’ as part of the annual school’s Health Immunisation Programme. This will occur in our school on is Wednesday 23th November. Consent forms to follow.</p>
<p>Pantomime: All P4-7 pupils today received a letter informing them of the details/cost of our school’s attendance at ‘The Pantomime’ in January. We need to have exact numbers confirmed shortly in order to finalise our booking and to make payment. Details of the P1-3 panto outing will be provided shortly.</p>
<p>GL Assessment Transfer Test: Any P7 parents wishing their child to sit the Post-Primary Consortium Entrance Test must register their child with the Registration Centre (Sacred Heart Grammar School) on/before 2.00pm on Friday 23rd September.</p>
<p>Lost Property: We have a large collection of coats/jackets left over from last year from all classes. We ask parents to come in and check through the box in the front foyer before they are recycled.</p>
